Baptisms – The 2nd & 4th Sunday of the month at 12:00 pm. Parents are required to attend Pre-Baptism Class. Arrangements must be made a minimum of 2 weeks prior to the date of baptism.

Baptism Class- Before you baptize your child, parish and diocesan policy require you to complete a **Baptism Preparation Class**. The next class will be held on **November 1, 2009** at Immaculate Heart Parish at 1:30 pm. Call 341-2734 to register.

There are no classes scheduled for December.

Godparent and Sponsor Certificate – Sponsors for Baptism or Confirmation must be **registered** and practicing members of the Church, attending weekly and Holy Day Masses for a minimum of 3 months prior to the celebration of the Sacraments for which they have requested the certificate. If you attend mass, but are not registered, please contact our parish office so that you can be registered here.

Pre -Cana Program for couples anticipating the Sacrament of Marriage will be held at the Jesuit Retreat House on **November 22nd** at 12:45 pm. This program satisfies the requirement for marriage preparation as stipulated by the Catholic Diocese of Cleveland. Call 440-884-9300 to register.

 The Church sets the correct "tone of voice" in the prescribed chants and "proprs." Pope John Paul II stated "The more closely a composition for church approaches . . .Gregorian melodic form, the more sacred and liturgical it becomes..." Fr. Buginini's Consilium (Secretary of the Consilium for the Implementation of the Constitution on the Liturgy) said the proprs (the chants) must always take priority otherwise the people are being cheated out of their Mass, - sing the Mass, not just anything.
