### Sunday, July 6th

**We welcome Father Librado Baluarte** to our parish the weekend of July 5<sup>th</sup> & 6<sup>th</sup>. Father Librado shall be making the mission appeal for the Diocese of Sorsogon in the Philippines. Please be generous to the mission.

The funds raised will be used for:

1. The education of 130 seminarians (80 in High School, 40 in College, 10 in Theology). Most parents of these young boys are poor and cannot afford to give them a priestly education, which has become more costly through the years. The Province of Sorsogon is one of the poorest in the region of Bicol, which is often hit by natural calamities such as typhoons and volcanic eruptions.
2. For pastoral programs, which focus on the formation of our lay men, and women, who are leaders in the Village Chapel Pastoral Councils. These lay leaders need continuing training so that they can effectively help the Parish Priests in the implementation of the Diocesan Ecclesial and Evangelization Program, which is intended for the economic, political, cultural and religious development of the people.

## **Time – Talent – Treasure**

When we need emotional rest, we sometimes take a vacation. But how do we find spiritual rest? How do we discover Christ's peace as we grapple with the complex issues of life deep in our hearts? Good stewards find their rest deep in the Lord. Reflect this week on what you do to welcome the peace of Christ into your heart.

## Karen's Corner

Did you know that Cardinal Timothy Dolan said, "I am convinced that Dorothy Day is a saint for our time. She exemplifies what's best in Catholic life, that ability we have to be 'both-and' not 'either-or'."? Dorothy Day felt that the Church's social teachings form a complete, indivisible package. She thought there were only two choices: Accept the whole gift, or reject it all. She said the only thing we can't do is fragment it, taking it piecemeal and dismissing those parts that conflict with our political or social views.

Dorothy Day was a woman who came to Catholicism later in her life, after she had an abortion and had been active in the Socialist Party. She became a journalist for *The Call*, New York's socialist newsweekly. It gave her barely enough to live on, but she saw it as a chance to directly influence social change. She was attracted to the Catholic Church because of its concern for the poor and vulnerable and was eventually baptized into the Catholic Faith. In 1933, along with Peter Maurin, launched *The Catholic Worker*, a paper that aimed to put Catholic social teaching in ordinary terms and to promote the transformation of society. The paper called for readers to respond to the need of the poor and especially the conditions of workers. The paper expressed dissatisfaction with the social order and took the side of labor unions, but its vision of the future challenged urbanization and industrialism. It was both radical and religious; it called on its readers to make personal changes in their own lives in order to identify with the poor and vulnerable. She also opened "hospitality houses" for the poor so they could get a meal and stay until they could manage on their own. Many of these houses still exist, and many more have been opened

in her name. She was a pacifist, who chose a nonviolent way of life. She felt she was called to live with the poor and entered into voluntary poverty. Here was a laywoman, a divorcee, a single mother – someone with a successful career as a journalist and author – who had given up everything that such success might have brought her, to instead share the dirt, lice, stench and endless miseries of God's urban poor. Only a woman of guts and extraordinary commitment could have endured such voluntary poverty. Dorothy was an incredible model of how to place our faith above our political views. She never identified with any political party, so it becomes very difficult to put her in any single category. I have made changes in my own life in order to help those who are poor and vulnerable.

I volunteer at a crisis shelter, I help out at a homeless shelter and feed the poor. And whenever I can, I purchase cases of food to donate to the Cleveland Food Pantry. I would rather do without cable TV than know there are hungry people out there that I didn't help in some way. She is not the only one to embrace a radical change in her life, Mother Teresa did also. We may not be called to that kind of radical change, but we are called to make small changes in order to help the poorest and most vulnerable in our society.

What are you doing to help? Think about it!
