Sick Calls – Please call the rectory to arrange for Father Jasany to bring the Sacraments when a member of your family is hospitalized.

Baptisms – The 1st & 3rd Sunday of the month at 12:00 pm. Parents are required to attend Pre-Baptism Class. Arrangements must be made a minimum of 2 weeks prior to the date of baptism. Before parents baptize their child, Diocesan and parish policy requires you to complete a Baptism Preparation Class. **The next class will be on Sunday, November 2nd at Immaculate Heart Parish at 1:30 pm.** Reservations are needed; please call 216-341-2734 for information or to make your reservation.

Godparent and Sponsor Certificate – Sponsors for Baptism or Confirmation must be registered and practicing members of the Church, attending weekly and Holy Day Masses for a minimum of 3 months prior to the celebration of the Sacraments for which they have requested the certificate. Dear Parishioners,

November is a month in which we pause to remember and give thanks. This weekend we celebrate the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed, All

Souls Day. Beginning with our Bereavement Mass at 4 pm on Saturday, November 1st and extending to the First Sunday of Advent, November 29th/30th, we will remember your loved ones who have died and all our deceased parishioners. Please remember to turn in your All Souls envelope. They will be placed on or near the altar of sacrifice. We will also schedule one Mass a month for All Souls.

I am grateful that in various ways the cost of our new church roof has been completely paid for. The new church roof cost \$88,800.00. Through your Rooted in Faith pledges, the Praise the Roof envelope, Memorial Gifts, Donations and various fundraisers, we have surpassed that amount by \$498.16! The amount collected to date is \$89,298.16.

Additional funds will be saved for further projects. There is always a need to invest in capital improvements and repairs on our four aging buildings.

We received a Rooted in Faith check for \$2701.00 and a distribution payment from the assets of Sacred Heart Parish for \$1735.14 this week. These funds will also be deposited into savings to be used for future projects. Additional donations and memorial gifts will go to future projects as well.

I am grateful for the wonderful custom that exists in our parish of giving memorial gifts in honor of our loved ones who have died. It is a fitting way to remember the generosity of our loved ones who have died. When this occurs, we acknowledge these gifts in our parish bulletin.

Please read the flyer on the Rooted in Faith donations in this week's bulletin. Again, I express my thanks for your continued generosity in this regard. To date, we have received \$34,845.00.

Also, there will be an upcoming Advent Retreat on December 12th/13th at Our Lady of Peace Parish. Please consider registering for this retreat to experience a deeper spiritual preparation for Advent. There is an announcement in this week's bulletin with all the information.

Karen's Korner

Did you know that the extra 7 books of the Old Testament, included in Catholic Bibles are called the "Deuterocanonicals" rather than Apocrypha? These 7 books included in Catholic Bibles were included in the Septuagint, which is the ancient Greek translation of the Hebrew Bible with additions, but are not included in the Hebrew text that forms both the canon for Judaism and the Protestant Old Testament.

During the end of the 4th century, Pope Damasus commissioned St. Jerome to prepare a Latin version of the Scriptures, later to be known as the Latin Vulgate. The 46 books of the Catholic Old Testament have been included in the canon of the Bible since 393 AD, but they were not given solemn approval by the church until the Council of Trent in 1546 AD.

Why are these books important? They are important because they contain information concerning the development of Jewish life and thought prior to the coming of Our Lord. Some of the things that have emerged through these books are the emergence of the sects of the Pharisees and Sadducees. They were not the same!

The Sadducees did not believe in an afterlife, but the Pharisees did. The political happenings of the Maccabees and the rise of what has been nowadays called "formative Judaism" is included. The growth of the belief in angels and demons first appears in these books. The first reflections on "original sin" are included here as well as the blossoming hope of a Messiah that would be coming soon and the resurrection of the body originate here!

Reading Scripture is meaningful and inspiring. What better way to start our day than to have a cup of coffee or tea and read one line of Scripture? Just one line! Jeremiah says, "Your words were found, and I ate them, and your words became to me a joy and the delight of my heart; for I am called by your name, O Lord, God of hosts." (Jer. 15:16) When was the last time you were nourished by the word of God? Taking the time to "chew" on a verse while drinking your morning coffee or tea is a great way to start the day!

Reading the Bible is an important part of our faith. Not sure where to begin? Start with the Gospel of Luke, or with the 3 letters of John. These are easy to read and easy to interpret. Make sure you read the introduction to each book to understand who the original audience was and to give some background on the culture of the time. Read until a word or phrase speaks to you and then stop, close your eyes, and repeat that word or phrase and ask God to show you the meaning in the phrase for your life. If you do this practice every night, you will be surprised at how nourished you will be!

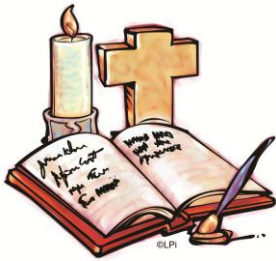

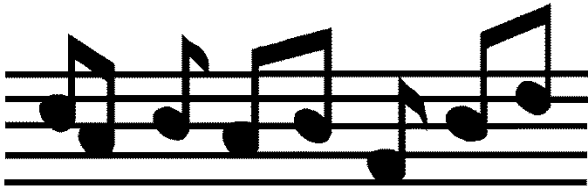
