Baptisms – The 2nd & 4th Sunday of the month at 12:00 pm. Parents are required to attend Pre-Baptism Class. Arrangements must be made a minimum of 2 weeks prior to the date of baptism. Before parents baptize their child Diocesan and parish policy requires you to complete a Baptism Preparation Class. **The next class will be on Sunday, June 7th at Our Lady of Lourdes Parish at 12:30 pm.** Please call 216-2829 to make a reservation.

Godparent and Sponsor Certificate – Sponsors for Baptism or Confirmation must be registered and practicing members of the Church, attending weekly and Holy Day Masses for a minimum of 3 months prior to the celebration of the Sacraments for which they have requested the certificate. Please note individuals 18 years of age and older, no longer in school, should register as adults. If you attend mass, but are not registered, please contact our parish office so that you can be registered here.

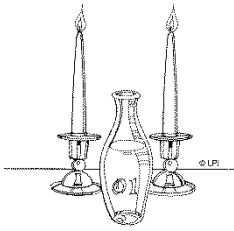
the school lobby. Please make sure your tickets have been turned in for today's drawing. If you are interested in purchasing tickets for the raffle, please stop over.

KAREN'S KORNER

Did you know that the last deadly sin is Lust? The Catechism defines lust as one of the Capital sins; it is an inordinate desire for earthly pleasures, particularly sexual pleasures. As we climb Dante's Mount Purgatorio, things get easier.

In Fr. Robert Barron's words, we are being readied for flight. Lust is treating another human being not as an end, but as an end but as a means for the satisfaction of my sexual pleasure. It is making the other person an object, a thing; thus taking away the dignity and respect that God has ingrained in every single person on earth.

Lust is using another person for *your* advantage or pleasure. Pope John Paul II said that "lust can happen even in marriage." We need to treat people with dignity and love. People say that pornography is a "victimless" crime. Those people want to do it, they are paid to do it, others say. But this is EXACTLY what is wrong with pornography – the other person is JUST an object, JUST a thing and not a person worthy of dignity and respect. Sex trafficking, child pornography, X-rated movies all treat human beings as objects, things and not blessings from God, which we all are. It is also what is wrong with sex outside of marriage. People are afraid they are "going to miss something" that it's just for fun, no one is being hurt; but the truth is people ARE being hurt when they are treated as nothing more than an object for pleasure. That is not what we were created for – to be an "object". We were created as children of God and this gives us all an innate worth and dignity. We were created to love and be loved, not to use and be used.

What is the antidote? Chastity. Sexual uprightness. A profound respect for the otherness of people and the refusal to turn another person into a sexual object.

Love is willing the good of the other as other. If you use pornography or go to inappropriate websites, stop! If you are addicted to sex, seek help! Examine the quality of your relationships and ask yourself, to what degree is need playing a part? If you are in a relationship that objectifies another person, stop! The Marian counter example is her response to the angel at the Annunciation: "But I know not man." Dante has the lustful people pass through fire. They have to do it quickly, but it is a purifying process. We are now at the top of the mountain and God wants us to be free. We have these bands of sin that wrap us up, but like Lazarus, Jesus says to us, "Untie them and let them go free!" Be free, my friends!
