Sick Calls – Please call the rectory to arrange for Father Jasany to bring the Sacraments when a member of your family is hospitalized.

Weddings – Parishioners are asked to call the rectory office at least 6 months in advance of the wedding to schedule an appointment with Father Jasany

Baptisms – The 1st & 3rd Sunday of the month at 12:00 pm. Parents are required to attend Pre-Baptism Class. Arrangements must be made a minimum of 2 weeks prior to the date of baptism. Before parents baptize their child, Diocesan and parish policy requires you to complete a Baptism Preparation Class. **The next class will be on Sunday, July 13th at Holy Name Parish at 1 PM.** Reservations are needed; please call 216-271-4242 for information or to make your reservation.

Godparent and Sponsor Certificate – Sponsors for Baptism or Confirmation must be registered and practicing members of the Church, attending weekly and Holy Day Masses for a minimum of 3 months prior to the celebration of the Sacraments for which they have requested the certificate. Please note individuals 18 years of age and older, no longer in school, need to register.

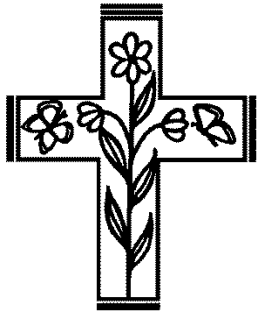

Karen's Corner

Did you know that Fr. Ronald Rolheiser, in his book "Prayer, Our Deepest Longing" identifies six "demons" that live inside of us? Remember that Jesus was tempted by Satan in the desert. Inside each of us is a saint and a sinner. We are torn in ways that leave us feeling unsure, guilty and tense. It's not easy being human! So what are these things inside of us?

First, *grandiosity*. This is the thing that tells us we are the center of the universe and that our lives are more important than those of others. We can become self-centered, pre-occupied with our own wants and needs and the urge to be the center of attention.

Second, *loneliness*. This is an unhealthy restlessness inside of us that tells us we will always be alone, unloved, excluded. It makes us desperate to find a way out of this feeling.

Third, *unbridled pleasure*. This can take the form of obsession addiction and lust. It makes us believe that [food, alcohol, drugs, sex, shopping, gambling, pornography, etc.] will make us feel better. This single pleasure is what will bring us peace and fulfillment, when we listen to that thought.

Fourth, *paranoia*; this is the feeling of bitterness, anger and jealousy. We begin to believe that life has cheated us and we have not been given our just place. This fills us with the need to be cynical, cold, distrustful and causes us to curse God.

Fifth, *woundedness* tells us that we are totally broken and for us, it is too late to be healed. The best we can do is to find comfort in the things listed above.

Lastly, *joylessness*, which is the feeling of self-pity, Oh, poor me, no one's problems are as bad as mine! These

thoughts cause us to believe that cynicism is wisdom; bitterness is justice; and joylessness is maturity.

Wow. I know each of these feelings! How do we counteract these feelings? How do we rid ourselves of them? It is scary to enter the desert, as Jesus did, to confront these things. But Scripture tells us that if we can muster the courage to face these things, God will send angels to minister to us and they will give us the feelings of calm, restfulness, patience, empathy, humility, joy, playfulness and humor.

We can memorize short prayers for these times, such as "Jesus, Son of God, have mercy on me, a sinner." Or memorize a Bible verse; my personal favorite is Romans 8:38-39 "For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor present things, nor future things, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor any other creature will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord!" We need to arm ourselves with prayer and Scripture in order to overcome these things. "For the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control". (Galatians 5:22-23)
