Sick Calls – Please call the rectory to arrange for Father Jasany to bring the Sacraments when a member of your family is hospitalized.

Weddings – Parishioners are asked to call the rectory office at least 6 months in advance of the wedding to schedule an appointment with Father Jasany

Baptisms – The 1st & 3rd Sunday of the month at 12:00 pm. Parents are required to attend Pre-Baptism Class. Arrangements must be made a minimum of 2 weeks prior to the date of baptism. Before parents baptize their child, Diocesan and parish policy requires you to complete a Baptism Preparation Class. **The next class will be on Sunday, July 13th at Holy Name Parish at 1 PM.** Reservations are needed; please call 216-271-4242 for information or to make your reservation.

Godparent and Sponsor Certificate – Sponsors for Baptism or Confirmation must be registered and practicing members of the Church, attending weekly and Holy Day Masses for a minimum of 3 months prior to the celebration of the Sacraments for which they have requested the certificate. Please note individuals 18 years of age and older, no longer in school, need to register.

family, yet plenty room for variety.

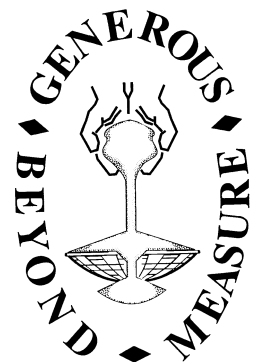

Food expired? Don't be so quick to toss it. Use by dates contribute to millions of pounds of food wasted each year. Use by and Best by are indications of foods peak of freshness, it does not indicate that the food is spoiled or unsafe to eat. Sell by is for retailers to rotate stock and means nothing to the consumer. (Source CNN Health)

Those who are 50 years old and over and members of AARP – They have a prescription discount card available at no charge to members. The discounts are on select prescriptions and there are no income levels to be eligible. To get the free card go to www.AARPpharmacy.com or call 1-877-422-7718.

Another Prescription discount program available at no cost is RX Outreach (must be income eligible.) They also have discounted prescription medication on select medications for 30, 90 or 180 days. To apply call 1-800-769-3880. To view medications available go to www.rxoutreach.org.

Karen's Corner

Did you know that the Bible contains stories of the good, the bad and the so-so? There are reasons why these stories are included in Scripture. These stories show us that we can repent and be forgiven; they tell us that there are consequences to all actions and they tell us what happens to the faithful and the not so faithful.

For example, In 1 and 2 Kings, the stories of Saul, David, Jezebel, and Rahab are all included even though they were holy people who had done some bad things because they were human! Saul was Israel's first king and was anointed by the prophet Samuel. He started out as a good and loving ruler, but after suffering a mental breakdown, he became extremely jealous of David and began to disobey God. He eventually killed himself after losing a battle to the Philistines. David was the most famous king of Israel. He became an instant hero after defeating Goliath with a slingshot. David was also a musician, poet, shepherd and a just ruler. Most of the book of Psalms was written by David. David spent years on the run from the jealous Saul, but even though he wanted to be king, he had too much respect for "God's anointed one", King Saul, to overthrow him while he was still alive. Yet, David made mistakes. He fell in love with Bathsheba, the wife of one of his generals, and even had a hand in causing the general's death in order to marry Bathsheba. Although God forgave David, there were consequences that lasted for the rest of his life. Jezebel was a Baal worshipping princess from Phoenicia and the wife of the seventh king of Israel, Ahab.

1 Kings 21:28 gives a clear picture of their reign: "No one was more determined than Ahab to disobey the Lord. And Jezebel encouraged him." Ahab began to worship Baal because of Jezebel; but the last straw was when they wanted a vineyard belonging to another man who wouldn't sell. So they plotted to have him put to death on false charges. The prophet Elijah sent Ahab a message from God telling him that he would die and Jezebel's body would be eaten by dogs, all of which came true. Then there was Rahab, one of only four women mentioned in the genealogy of Jesus in the gospel of Matthew. She was a "special" inn keeper in the city of Jericho. After the death of Moses, Joshua became the leader of the Israelites, and as they approached Jericho, he sent two spies into the city to see how well the city was guarded. They came to Rahab's place and she recognized them as being holy men, for she had heard of the Israelite God and accepted Him. When soldiers of the city came to Rahab to get the spies, she hid them in her bundles of flax. She made a deal with the spies that she would not tell anyone about their army if they would save her and her family. So the spies told her to hang a red cord from her window where all would see it and know not to attack that family. When the battle was won by Joshua, Rahab and her family joined the Israelites in the Promised Land.

These stories tell us it is ok to be human as long as we repent of our sins and shortcomings. Read about Josiah, Hezekiah, Solomon, Rehoboam and others. They are great stories!
