## Karen's Corner

Did you know that in 1866, in order to curb the spread of Hansen's disease (leprosy) they isolated the lepers on the island of Molokai? On three sides, the colony bordered the Pacific Ocean and on the fourth side were massive 1600-foot cliffs. Once the lepers were out of sight and no longer a threat to the general population, the government turned a blind eye to their basic needs. Shipments of food and supplies slowed down and the government removed most of its people. The result was a hugely dysfunctional community marked by poverty, alcoholism, violence and promiscuity.

Brother Damien, of the Congregation of the Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary, came to the island in 1873, and was appalled at the conditions he found there. He had been warned by his superiors not to touch the lepers, not to let them touch him and not to eat with them. But Damien made the decision to overcome his fear of contagion and enter into the life of the Molokai lepers. He committed himself to visit every leper on the island and find out what they needed. One of the first things he did was to build a fence around the local cemetery to show the islanders that they mattered, that their graves would no longer be scavenged by dogs and pigs. He brought the sacraments to those who were bedridden; he washed their bodies and bandaged their wounds. He made their rooms comfortable and did everything he could to make sure the people were as comfortable as possible. He did something that our Lord did, he *touched* people physically. The lepers were surprised at this action as other missionaries, doctors and others would not touch them.

Damien not only touched them, he embraced them, dined with them, put his

thumb on their forehead to anoint them and placed the Eucharist on their tongues. All of these things showed the lepers dignity and that their lives had value, which is what these people needed the most. Damien had the lepers share in the workload by building coffins and cottages as well as constructing a new road. Damien was able to lift these people up and they became cheerful and happy.

In 1884, Damien contracted leprosy, which developed quickly. He wrote to his brother: "I make myself a leper with the lepers to gain all in Jesus Christ." What Damien teaches us is that we need to share in the suffering of others as well as finding a way to alleviate that suffering. We can also learn that solidarity requires an active choice. It requires taking regular, intentional steps into communion with others, even when they lead us into uncomfortable situations. We need to treat everyone with honor and dignity no matter what their situation, as that is what Jesus did. He touched those around them and loved them in ways that were not "the norm".

What are we doing to continue to spread this love of our Lord?
