Before parents baptize their child, Diocesan and parish policy requires you to complete a Baptism Preparation Class. **The next class will be on Sunday, November 2nd at Immaculate Heart Parish at 1:30 pm.** Reservations are needed; please call 216-341-2734 for information or to make your reservation.

Godparent and Sponsor Certificate – Sponsors for Baptism or Confirmation must be registered and practicing members of the Church, attending weekly and Holy Day Masses for a minimum of 3 months prior to the celebration of the Sacraments for which they have requested the certificate. Please note individuals 18 years of age and older, no longer in school, need to register.

Dear Parishioners,

We had a beautiful celebration of St. Wenceslaus Day. I am grateful to our parish staff, the St. Wenceslaus Committee and the volunteers who assisted us.

I thank Kimm Bunch, our Finance Council Chairperson and the Members of our Finance Council – Charles Beargie, Jim Fletcher, Marge Lanzola, Nancy Recko, Lynne Sempruch and Pauline Kowalski for preparing and presenting our annual parish financial report. I am grateful to Pauline for the many hours of work, which she devoted to this project.

Because of your generosity we saw the completion of the following Capital Improvements – a new church roof, tuck pointing on the Church, the outside painting of the Rose Window in our choir loft, the installation of two new rooftop heating & air conditioning units on our school roof and the rewiring of the second and third floors of our rectory.

As a Stewardship Parish, we are called to reflect upon God's Blessings, and then with a grateful heart, we share our time, treasure and talent. Karen's Korner

Did you know that the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is not just for people who are near death? The USCCB says, "Christ's compassion toward the sick and his healing of almost every kind of infirmity are a resplendent sign that 'God has visited his people'." (CCC #1050) For most of us, there is nothing more frustrating than being sick. Illness can run from an annoying inconvenience, like a headache, to grave, life-threatening cases involving major surgery or incurable disease. But in each case illness reminds us of our human limitations.

The Rite of Anointing tells us there is no need to wait until a person is at the point of death to receive the Sacrament. A judgment that the illness is of a serious nature is enough. The Sacrament may be repeated if the sick person recovers after the anointing but becomes ill once again, or if, during the same illness, the person's condition becomes more serious. A person should be anointed before surgery when a dangerous illness is the reason for the intervention. Also, the elderly may be anointed if they are in weak condition even though no dangerous illness is present. Sick children may be anointed if they have sufficient use of reason to be comforted by this sacrament.

The faithful should be encouraged to ask for the anointing and, as soon as the time for the anointing comes, to receive it with faith and devotion, not misusing the sacrament by putting it off. (USCCB Catechism pg. 253) Only priests and bishops may administer the sacrament. But there are special graces that come with anointing. The Sacrament unites the sick person to the passion of Christ, for his own good and that of the whole Church.

It gives the sick person the strength, peace and courage to endure in a Christian manner the sufferings of illness or old age. It imparts the forgiveness of sins, if the sick person was not able to obtain it through the sacrament of Reconciliation. It provides for the restoration of health, if it is conducive to the salvation of the soul. And it helps the sick person in the preparation for passing over to eternal life.

In the last couple of years of his life, my father was anointed several times. I know it helped strengthen him for his journey home. In St. James' letter, he says, "Is anyone among you sick? They should call for the elders of the church and have them pray over them anointing them with oil in the name of the Lord. The prayer of faith will save the sick, and the Lord will raise them up; and anyone who has committed sins will be forgiven." I have received the sacrament before surgeries and when I was first diagnosed with diabetes. It gives me comfort and strength, knowing I am not alone in this journey!
