Sick Calls – Please call the rectory to arrange for Father Jasany to bring the Sacraments when a member of your family is hospitalized.

Weddings – Parishioners are asked to call the rectory office at least 6 months in advance of the wedding to schedule an appointment with Father Jasany

Baptisms – The 1st & 3rd Sunday of the month at 12:00 pm. Parents are required to attend Pre-Baptism Class. Arrangements must be made a minimum of 2 weeks prior to the date of baptism. Before parents baptize their child, Diocesan and parish policy requires you to complete a Baptism Preparation Class. **The next class will be on Wednesday, January 7, 2015 at St. Stanislaus Parish at 7 pm.** Reservations are needed; please call 216-341-9091 to make your reservation.

Godparent and Sponsor Certificate – Sponsors for Baptism or Confirmation must be registered and practicing members of the Church, attending weekly and Holy Day Masses for a minimum of 3 months prior to the celebration of the Sacraments for which they have requested the certificate. Please note individuals 18 years of age and older, no longer in school, need to register.

Karen's Korner

Did you know that the Christmas stories in Matthew and Luke were not meant to be “charming” children’s stories, but rather stories of opposition and confrontation?

Let me ask you this, why did Jesus come as a baby? I love C. S. Lewis’s response to that, he says, “Jesus had to slip clandestinely behind enemy lines.” I love that image! Jesus sort of sneaks into the world that is being ruled by the great Caesar Augustus! Luke makes it very clear from the beginning that this story is not about Caesar, but about another king. Who was the most protected king in the world? Caesar! But Luke tells us that the true king arrives vulnerable and exposed because the good life is not about the protection of the ego, but rather about the willingness to become open to the other in love! Who was the best dressed in the kingdom? Caesar! But Jesus was a newborn infant without even the power to lift his own head! He was wrapped in swaddling band, and that is the ultimate picture of weakness. Who was the freest person in the kingdom? Caesar! But Luke tells us that true kingship hasn’t anything to do with earthly domination, but rather the willingness to be bound to other people for their sake and for loves sake. Who was the best fed person in the world? Caesar! And where was the newborn king placed? In a manger, an animal’s eating place. He who is to become the Bread for the World, is placed in trough where animals would have eaten. The true king is willing to offer himself as food for the world!

These reflections are based on Fr Robert Barron’s “Catholicism DVD: Amazed and Afraid.”

I think the last thing Fr. Barron talks about is how the angels appeared to shepherds. We have a romanticized vision of shepherds, but they were basically the outcasts of the time. A host of angels appears to the shepherds. The Greek word is “*stratia*” or army. A whole army of angels appeared to the shepherds! Who wouldn’t be frightened? But the angel tells the shepherds, “Do not be afraid. I bring you good news of great joy!” Who had the biggest army? Caesar! But his army is nothing compared to the army of God, the *stratia* of angels that line up behind the new baby king. The good news is that the savior of the world comes to us not as a warrior, but as a helpless child coming out of his manger/crib. I mentioned the prophets last week, and their words are beautiful and tell us of the King to come. In this second week of Advent, what have you done to become closer to Jesus?

On Wednesday, December 10, join me to learn how to more deeply pray with Scripture using the technique *Lectio Divina*. And then, please join me this Friday, December 12, 2014 for the Hallmark Hall of Fame movie, “The Gift of Love: A Christmas Story.” Both programs start at 6:30 pm in the rectory.
