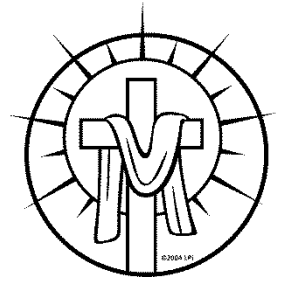


Dear Parishioners,

Sick Calls – Please call the rectory to arrange for Father Jasany to bring the Sacraments when a member of your family is hospitalized.

Weddings – Parishioners are asked to call the rectory office at least 6 months in advance of the wedding to schedule an appointment with Father Jasany

Baptisms – The 1st & 3rd Sunday of the month at 12:00 pm. Parents are required to attend Pre-Baptism Class.

Arrangements must be made a minimum of 2 weeks prior to the date of baptism. Before parents baptize their child, Diocesan and parish policy requires you to complete a Baptism Preparation Class.

The next class will be on Sunday, April 12th at Holy Name Parish at 1:00 pm. Reservations needed; please call 216-4242 to make your reservation.

Godparent and Sponsor Certificate – Sponsors for Baptism or Confirmation must be registered and practicing members of the Church, attending weekly and Holy Day Masses for a minimum of 3 months prior to the celebration of the Sacraments for which they have requested the certificate. Please note individuals 18 years of age and older, no longer in school, need to register.

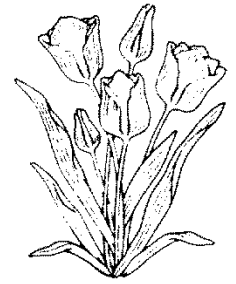


Parish

Stewardship – When the risen Christ encounters his disciples in the locked room he adds a new Beatitude to the ones we've heard proclaimed before: Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed. Stewards of the mysteries of God's love do not need proof of the risen Christ. They know it because their lives have been transformed by the power of the Holy Spirit who has breathed new life into them. As stewards of this great gift it is appropriate to reflect on how we in turn add new life into our parish communities.

Karen's Corner

Did you know that the Sixth deadly sin is Gluttony? The Catechism defines gluttony as the Capital Sin that describes actions of eating and drinking more than what is necessary. This is a vice of mine!

Fr. Barron tells us that we are now at the tip top of Mt. Purgatory according to Dante. Still a deadly sin, but it involves the dominance of reason by the passions. Dante has more sympathy for them because as Carl Jung said, "At the bottom, all psychological problems are spiritual problems." Gluttony is a spiritual problem. Thomas Aquinas tells us it is "the immoderate or unreasonable pleasure of food or drink." Yup, that would be me. Sigh. There is nothing wrong with taking pleasure in things unless they begin to overtake our lives. Sensual pleasures are a gift from God, they are good things, but we can make those things our gods instead of saving ourselves for the God who made us. You know, we have been hard-wired for God as St. Augustine puts it, "You have made us for yourself O Lord, and our hearts are restless until they rest in you." I know I have a tendency to try and "push down" my worries, concerns and problems by stuffing my face with all kinds of sweet and salty things! But all that does, is make me feel guilty about what I've done, and nothing is resolved. I can see the effects in my body, my blood pressure and glucose numbers.

What we tend to do is try to find some substitute, some finite good, instead of seeking to fill that hunger with something that is infinite and will never decay or harm us. Jesus' first temptation after 40 days in the desert was sensual pleasure, "Turn these stones into bread!" The temptation is to make bodily desires the *center* of our life!

When we do that, the deeper and abiding hungers never surface! We don't have to admit that we need God and that we need to learn more through reading Scripture and spiritual books and attending Mass and having an active prayer life! The desire for food, drink and sex are like kids, I want it and have to have it now, now, now!!! If you indulge these "kids" they will take over our lives. We have to discipline those desires, so as to allow the greater good to emerge.

Fr. Barron says gluttony in today's world is another word for "addiction". So what are you addicted to? Computer games? Sports? Food? Alcohol? Exercise? Shopping? Or a myriad of other things!

Gluttony is not just about food, but it is about the excess of anything in our lives that we choose over spending time in prayer and meditation.

I have lost weight over the past year because of the realization that instead of facing whatever was bothering me, I would find something else to do to avoid it. It is not easy to face our addictions and look at what needs changed in our lives, but it is necessary.

What is the active virtue? Asceticism. Fast! Skip a meal and give the money you would have spent to the poor and spend time in prayer. Instead of going out drinking, read Scripture, pray the rosary! Purposely avoid certain foods that you like. Dante punishes the gluttonous by having them repeatedly pray, "O Lord, open my lips and my mouth will declare your praise!"
