Sick Calls – Please call the rectory to arrange for Father Jasany to bring the Sacraments when a member of your family is hospitalized.

Weddings – Parishioners are asked to call the rectory office at least 6 months in advance of the wedding to schedule an appointment with Father Jasany.

Baptisms – The 1st & 3rd Sunday of the month at 12:00 pm. Parents are required to attend Pre-Baptism Class.

Arrangements must be made a minimum of 2 weeks prior to the date of baptism. Before parents baptize their child, Diocesan and parish policy requires you to complete a Baptism Preparation Class.

The next class will be on Wednesday, July 8th at St. Stanislaus Parish.

Reservations needed; please call 216-341-9091 to make your reservation.

Godparent and Sponsor Certificate – Sponsors for Baptism or Confirmation must be registered and practicing members of the Church, attending weekly and Holy Day Masses for a minimum of 3 months prior to the celebration of the Sacraments for which they have requested the certificate. Please note individuals 18 years of age and older, no longer in school, need to register.

The Vincentian Missionaries, all natives of India, need our help to carry out their many missionary, educational and charitable activities in their missions. Stewardship – In today's second reading, St. Paul offers the community at Corinth a spirituality of giving. He urges them to give and helps them understand that through their generosity, they will in turn be recipients of a spiritual abundance. They will receive from those who are the beneficiaries of their own giving; a reciprocal gift that amounts to an equality of giving through the generosity of Christ. A good reflection this week would be how Christian stewards enjoy spiritual abundance through Christ Jesus because of their generosity.

Karen's Corner

Did you know that Pope Francis has a Master's Degree in Chemistry? In the Middle Ages, scholarship was synonymous with religious life. Monks recorded and preserved libraries of ancient books. Priests made advances in astronomy, medicine, mathematics, and other sciences. The university system was Catholic - not just run by the Church but literally filled with priests and religious who served as doctors, teachers, philosophers, and advisors to Lords.

None of this is exactly a secret and anyone with a cursory knowledge of the Middle Ages ought to know that the Church was a pillar of all learning in Europe. Science and religion can be compatible. Then there is the story of Galileo. There is not enough room here to go into the whole theory and trial surrounding Galileo, but here are some facts: Galileo was never tortured and was never in fear of being tortured. He was never imprisoned; it was more of a house arrest since he was aged and not in good health. The trial consisted of Galileo, two officials and a secretary. The biggest problem the Church had with Galileo was that his theory was not yet proven and the church was afraid that the beliefs of the simple people might be disturbed at the idea that the truths of the Bible had been disproved by science.

The problem was not the theory itself, but the fact that Galileo was teaching his theory as fact without the proof needed to back up his claims. This was followed by the fact that in the next century, Pope Benedict XIV (14th) approved the publication of Galileo's works and granted them an Imprimatur!

Galileo was not an atheist, in fact he would not like it at all that society tells us the Church and science are opposed to each other, because they are not. There are things in science that the Church does not agree with such as cloning and embryonic stem cell research because of the dignity of the human person, but the idea of evolution is neither denied nor confirmed in the Church.

If we believe in evolution, we do so knowing that God created the world and evolution is a part of creation. Scripture speaks to us of the origin of the universe in order to state the correct relationship of humanity with God and the universe. Where does that leave faith? Hebrews 11:1 says "now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the convictions of things not seen." Our faith is in God, whom we cannot see, but we can experience. Atheists want us to "prove" there is a God, but we can't. There is plenty of evidence for God, but no actual "proof". That is why our faith is so valuable. We know the truth about God and because of that we can accept scientific findings. But looking only through the lens of science, narrows a person's vision and experience. The Bible is not a scientific or historical textbook, rather it reveals what God wants us to know for the sake of our salvation.

Keep your eyes and ears open and I will see you soon!

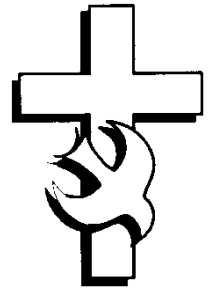
