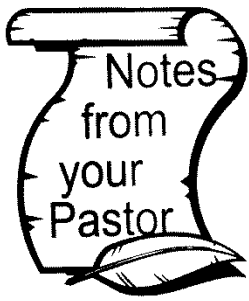
Sick Calls – Please call the rectory to arrange for Father Jasany to bring the Sacraments when a member of your family is hospitalized.

Weddings – Parishioners are asked to call the rectory office at least 6 months in advance of the wedding to schedule an appointment with Father Jasany.

Baptisms – The 1st & 3rd Sunday of the month at 12:00 pm. Parents are required to attend Pre-Baptism Class. Arrangements must be made a minimum of 2 weeks prior to the date of baptism. Before parents baptize their child, Diocesan and parish policy requires you to complete a Baptism Preparation Class. **The next class will be on Sunday, January 3, 2016 at Immaculate Heart Parish at 1:30 pm.** Reservations needed; please call 216-341-2734.

Godparent and Sponsor Certificate – Sponsors for Baptism or Confirmation must be registered and practicing members of the Church, attending weekly and Holy Day Masses for a minimum of 3 months prior to the celebration of the Sacraments for which they have requested the certificate. Please note individuals 18 years of age and older, no longer in school, need to register.

Dear Parishioners,

We continue our Advent journey. December 8th is a Holy day of Obligation. We will celebrate the Solemnity of the

Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Everyone is required to go to Mass for this Holy day. We will have Masses at 7 pm on Monday, December 7th and 8:30 am and 4 pm on Tuesday, December 8th.

December 8th begins the Holy Year of Mercy, which goes to November 20, 2016. We are called to turn to the Merciful Face of God the Father as exemplified in the Parable of the Loving Father who forgives the Prodigal Son. As we receive mercy, we are called to extend mercy.

Pope Francis states, It is a favorable time to heal wounds, a time to offer everyone the way of Forgiveness and Reconciliation. We can concentrate on the Corporal Works of Mercy and the Spiritual Works of Mercy. The Corporal Works of Mercy are: to feed the hungry, to give drink to the thirsty, to clothe the naked, to shelter the homeless, to care for the sick, to visit the imprisoned and to bury the dead. The spiritual Works of Mercy are to convert sinners, to instruct the ignorant, to advise the doubtful, to comfort the sorrowful, to bear wrongs patiently, to forgive injuries and to pray for the Living and the Dead.

This year is a year to focus upon healing, forgiving and helping.

We will have private Eucharistic Adoration after the 4 pm Mass on Saturday, December 12th from 5 to 5:30 pm. Our Solemn Closing Service will be at 5:30 pm. Please come and spend quiet

time before Our Lord. Together, let us be still before the Saving Presence of Christ in the Eucharist.

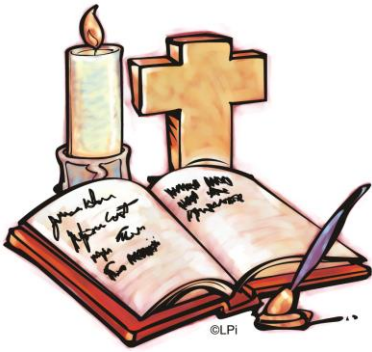

A Year of Mercy

Why Mercy? There's is a tremendous need for mercy in our world today. Pope Francis wants our parishes to become "islands of mercy in a sea of indifference" (Message for Lent 2015). Pope Francis discusses mercy and his desires for the jubilee year in *Misericordiae Vultus* (MV), the official proclamation of the Year of Mercy. He wants us to bring "consolation to the poor...liberty to those bound by new forms of slavery in our modern society," spiritual sight to those who have lost touch with God, and human dignity to those whom it has been taken (16).

Pope Francis envisions a year when people will become more merciful in their own lives and bring God's mercy to others. He is entrusting the extraordinary jubilee year to the "Lordship of Christ" and asks Christ to pour out his mercy on the entire cosmos.

What will happen? On December 8th, the Feast of the Immaculate Conception and the 5th anniversary of the close of the Second Vatican Council, Pope Francis will open a Holy Door in St. Peter's Basilica that remains sealed except during jubilee years. When he crosses the threshold, this door will become a "Door of Mercy." In the weeks that follow, Holy Doors will be opened by cardinals and bishops in basilicas, cathedrals and shrines all over the world.

Throughout the extraordinary jubilee year, there will also be special events. We will focus on these events in the upcoming weeks and months.
