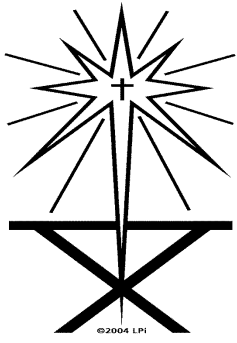
Sick Calls – Please call the rectory to arrange for Father Jasany to bring the Sacraments when a member of your family is hospitalized.

Weddings – Parishioners are asked to call the rectory office at least 6 months in advance of the wedding to schedule an appointment with Father Jasany.

Baptisms – The 1st & 3rd Sunday of the month at 12:00 pm. Parents are required to attend Pre-Baptism Class. Arrangements must be made a minimum of 2 weeks prior to the date of baptism. Before parents baptize their child, Diocesan and parish policy requires you to complete a Baptism Preparation Class. **The next class will be on Sunday, January 3, 2016 at Immaculate Heart Parish at 1:30 pm.** Reservations needed; please call 216-341-2734.

Godparent and Sponsor Certificate – Sponsors for Baptism or Confirmation must be registered and practicing members of the Church, attending weekly and Holy Day Masses for a minimum of 3 months prior to the celebration of the Sacraments for which they have requested the certificate. Please note individuals 18 years of age and older, no longer in school, need to register.

Sunday, January 3rd

***Epiphany of Our
Lord***

Throughout Germany
at this time of year,
you will find most
main doorways inscribed with the
following: 20+C+M+B+16. Children known
as Sternsinger (star singers) dress up and
go door to door, requesting candy for
themselves and money for the Church. As
they leave, the house is blessed and the
inscription written in chalk. The 20 and 16
refer to the year, the CMB are said to
represent either Caspar, Melchior and
Balthasar, the Magi; or the Latin Christus
Mansionem Benedicat, which means
"Christ, bless this Home." Today, we
celebrate the feast of the Epiphany, in
which we remember the adoration of the
newborn Christ by three wise men from the
East. This should leave no doubt in
anyone's mind just how far and wide the
promise of a Savior had spread. These
representatives of pagan religions from
other lands were determined to pay their
respects. It was as if they were born to do
this, to acknowledge in some way the
beginning of the greatest reign of the
greatest king of all. The Epiphany is the
third manifestation of the mystery of the
Incarnation, following the Annunciation
and the Birth of Christ. Today is truly the
beginning of the paschal mystery.

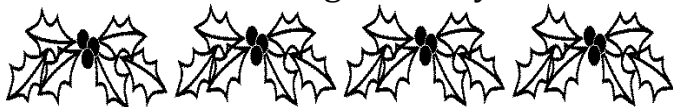

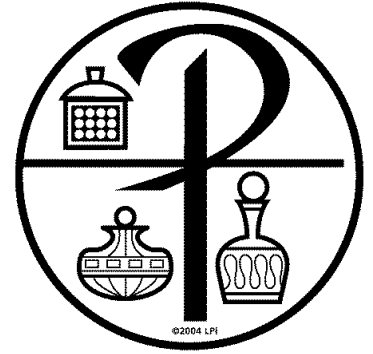

CONTRIBUTIONS – In order for your contributions to be considered for the 2015 Tax Year, they must be received by December 31, 2015 and your check must be dated 2015. Contributions received on or after January 1, 2015 will be reported as 2016 contributions.

This complies with IRS Requirements.
