Sick Calls – Please call the rectory to arrange for Father Jasany to bring the Sacraments when a member of your family is hospitalized.

Weddings – Parishioners are asked to call the rectory office at least 6 months in advance of the wedding to schedule an appointment with Father Jasany.

Baptisms – The 1st & 3rd Sunday of the month at 12:00 pm. Parents are required to attend Pre-Baptism Class. Arrangements must be made a minimum of 2 weeks prior to the date of baptism. Before parents baptize their child, Diocesan and parish policy requires you to complete a Baptism Preparation Class. **The next class will be on Wednesday, April 6th at St. Stanislaus Parish at 7 pm.** Reservations needed; please call 216-341-9091 to make your reservation.

Godparent and Sponsor Certificate – Sponsors for Baptism or Confirmation must be registered and practicing members of the Church, attending weekly and Holy Day Masses for a minimum of 3 months prior to the celebration of the Sacraments for which they have requested the certificate. Please note individuals 18 years of age and older, no longer in school, need to register.

Dear Parishioners,

I wish you and your loved ones a very Happy Easter!

I pray that all of us may experience the New Life that comes from the Cross and Resurrection of our

Blessed Lord. Christ is Risen from the Dead! Alleluia! Alleluia!

We congratulate Destinee Lynn Hromadka, who received Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist at our Easter Vigil. We welcome her to our parish community.

We will begin to launch our "Touch Up the Towers" Capital Campaign for the second phase of the repairs that need to be done to our church building. Both the church towers and the exterior of the church building have pockets of deterioration. We hope to do a Capital Campaign similar to the Praise the Roof Campaign. The cost of repairing the church towers is \$98,380.00. The cost of doing the church tuck-pointing Phase Two is \$58,285.00. Once the exterior work is completed, we hope to repair and paint the choir loft ceiling for \$25,000.00. The total cost of this project is \$181,665.00. We have already raised \$88,776.58 towards this project from pledges to the Rooted in Faith/Forward in Hope Campaign and also from the Sacred Heart Parish distributions. This means we have to raise \$92,888.42.

Similar to the Praise the Roof Campaign, the "Touch Up the Towers" Campaign will raise funds from future Rooted in

Faith/Forward in Hope payments, Memorial Gifts, our Fund Raisers and a special "Touch Up the Towers" envelope in your monthly envelope packet. We ask your help in raising the necessary funds to pay for this project.

Easter is connected with New Life. Hopefully, we are awakened to New Life inside us and around us. Karen Small is coordinating our Garden Committee. The garden committee will meet the First Saturday of the month. Their first meeting will be on Saturday, April 2nd from 9:30 am to 11:30 am. If you are interested in joining this committee, please contact the rectory office. We will pass along your name to Karen Small, who will contact you.

During the Easter Season, may we be reawakened to the Living Christ who dwells with us and around us.

Today is Divine Mercy

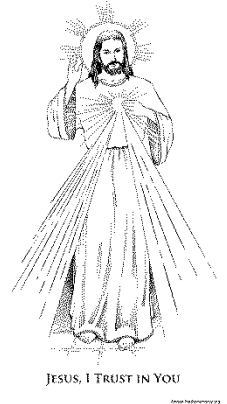
Sunday. The Divine Mercy Chaplet will be prayed a half-hour before our Masses today.

This turning with trust to Him who is mercy itself is the only source of peace for mankind. To fittingly observe the Feast of Mercy:

1. Celebrate the Feast on the Sunday after Easter
2. Sincerely repent all sins
3. Place complete trust in Jesus
4. Go to confession, preferably before that Sunday, However, if not able to, 20 days before or after that Sunday is acceptable.
5. Receive communion on the Feast Day.
6. Venerate the Image of Divine Mercy.
7. Be merciful to others through our actions, words and prayers .

An extra benefit in this the Year of Divine Mercy, beside the complete forgiveness of sins and punishment for ourselves, we can apply for ourselves, and we can apply a plenary indulgences to a soul in Purgatory on the Feast of Divine Mercy.

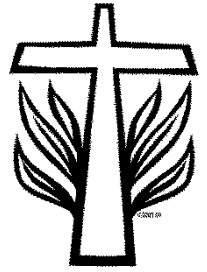
