Sick Calls – Please call the rectory to arrange for Father Jasany to bring the Sacraments when a member of your family is hospitalized.

Weddings – Parishioners are asked to call the rectory office at least 6 months in advance of the wedding to schedule an appointment with Father Jasany.

Baptisms – The 1st & 3rd Sunday of the month at 12:00 pm. Parents are required to attend Pre-Baptism Class. Arrangements must be made a minimum of 2 weeks prior to the date of baptism. Before parents baptize their child, Diocesan and parish policy requires you to complete a Baptism Preparation Class. **The next class will be on Wednesday, April 6th at St. Stanislaus Parish at 7 pm.** Reservations needed; please call 216-341-9091 to make your reservation.

Godparent and Sponsor Certificate – Sponsors for Baptism or Confirmation must be registered and practicing members of the Church, attending weekly and Holy Day Masses for a minimum of 3 months prior to the celebration of the Sacraments for which they have requested the certificate. Please note individuals 18 years of age and older, no longer in school, need to register.

Dear Parishioners,

Our Holy Week and Easter celebrations were wonderful! I am grateful to everyone who worked on our services and I am

thankful to everyone who attended these liturgies.

We again congratulate Destinee Lynn Hromadka, who received Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist at our Easter Vigil. We welcome her to our parish community.

I would like to thank all of our liturgical ministers, Sue McDonough, our Sacristan and our parish staff members – Pauline Kowalski, Judy Lasecki, Anthony Laboy and Jan Vitt for their help. I am grateful to everyone who decorated our church so beautifully. I am very thankful to Marge Lanzola and the many volunteers who helped with the Good Friday Stations of the Cross. I express my gratitude to our parish musicians – Buck McDaniel, Ralph Bednarz and the Schola, Terry Weiss, Sandy Yody, and our Contemporary Music Ministry.

It was an inspirational week. I hope that as we continue to celebrate the Fifty Days of Easter we can recall frequently that Christ the Risen Lord is truly present here. This weekend, we celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday. We will pray the Divine Mercy Chaplet a half hour before every Mass. We have the image of Divine Mercy displayed in various forms in our church – the screen by St. Joseph's altar, the banner over the pulpit and the picture by my confessional.

Go up to the Gospel pulpit and take a good look at the Paschal Candle. It is the Jubilee of Mercy Candle. Christ as the

Good Shepherd is carrying a lost soul on His shoulders. On the candle, you can see streams of red and blue. When the side of Christ was pierced on the cross, blood and water flowed from His side. Red for Blood, Blue for Water. The red represents Eucharist; the blue represents Baptism. On the candle are the words "Merciful like the Father." We are called to experience Mercy and to extend Mercy.

As we commence to raise the needed funds for repairing our church towers and tuck-pointing our church building, please use your yellow "Touch Up the Towers" envelopes that are in your monthly envelope packet. We will also have yellow envelopes in the pews. I am very grateful for the custom of making memorial gifts in honor of our loved ones who have died. 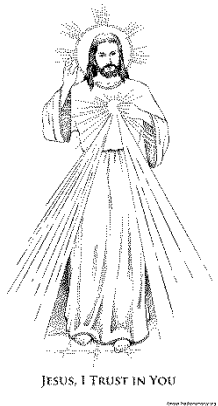
