Sick Calls – Please call the rectory to arrange for Father Jasany to bring the Sacraments when a member of your family is hospitalized.

Weddings – Parishioners are asked to call the rectory office at least 6 months in advance of the wedding to schedule an appointment with Father Jasany.

Baptisms – The 1st & 3rd Sunday of the month at 12:00 pm. Parents are required to attend Pre-Baptism Class.

Arrangements must be made a minimum of 2 weeks prior to the date of baptism. Before parents baptize their child, Diocesan and parish policy requires you to complete a Baptism Preparation Class.

The next class will be on Sunday, April 2nd at Holy Name Parish at 1 pm.

Godparent and Sponsor Certificate –

Sponsors for Baptism or Confirmation must be registered and practicing members of the Church, attending weekly and Holy Day Masses for a minimum of 3 months prior to the celebration of the Sacraments for which they have requested the certificate. Please note individuals 18 years of age and older, no longer in school, need to register.

Dear Parishioners,

When we were signed with ashes on Ash Wednesday we heard the words “Repent and Believe in the Gospel.”

Lent calls us to go on retreat. We take steps in prayer, fasting and almsgiving. Part of a traditional retreat is to receive the Sacrament of Penance, that is, go to confession.

We will celebrate our Parish Communal Penance Service on Monday, March 7th at 7 pm. We will have four priests present to hear your confessions. The church calls us to gather as a parish community to celebrate the Sacrament of Penance. We confess our sins and repent. We receive healing forgiveness as we meet our merciful God and hopefully we extend that forgiveness to others. Please plan to attend this special celebration. Consider inviting others to come with you. Perhaps you know of people, maybe in your own family, who have “fallen away” from the active practice of the Catholic faith. Invite them to come, possibly with you. Extend the invitation for someone to come to Jesus.

We will celebrate the Rite of Sending for our five catechumens – Dave Guess, Breyant Kosek, Kylei Kosek, Chevalyn Kosek and D’Artagnon Kosek as well as our one candidate, Alexandra Maricic at our 11 am Mass on Sunday, March 5th. Our Catechumens will be receiving Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist at our Easter Vigil this year.

Our candidate will profess her faith, receive First Eucharist and Confirmation at the same vigil as well.

Later in the evening all six will travel to the Cathedral of St. John the Evangelist for the Rite of Election and Continuing Conversion before a Bishop. They will be united with other catechumens and candidates from other parts of our Diocese. Please keep them in your prayers.

The point of the Lenten/Easter journey is to be transformed by the power of the Cross and Resurrection of Jesus Christ. Lent stands for conversion, for change of heart. Along with the psalmist let us pray, “Lord, create in me a new heart and renew within me a steadfast spirit.”

I hope to see many of you in our church this Monday evening, March 7th at 7 pm for our Communal Penance Service. I pray that this may be a grace-filled celebration for all who come.

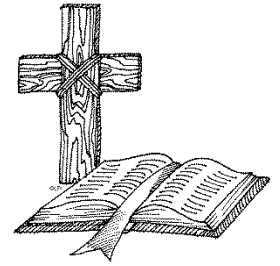

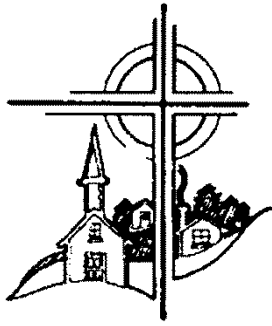
