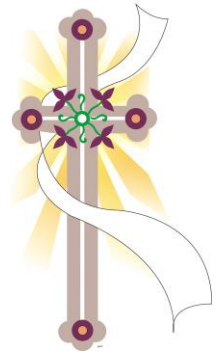
To fittingly observe the Feast of Mercy:
